Town of Franklin Ordinance on the Establishment of the Procedure for the Election of Members to the Zoning Board of Appeals

Pursuant to the provisions of Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 124, the Town of Franklin hereby amends its 1962 Ordinance on the Creation of the Zoning Board of Appeals to read as follows:

SECTION I: The Zoning Board of Appeals shall consist of five members and three alternates. The members and alternates of the Board at the time of the adoption of this ordinance shall continue in office until their terms would otherwise have expired. Members and alternates shall thereafter be elected to a four-year terms as follows:

- at the 1983 election, three members and two alternates
- at the 1985 election, two members and one alternate
- and thereafter, according to the same pattern

Vacancies occurring among the members or the alternates shall be filled by the Board of Selectmen until the next regular municipal election.

SECTION II: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain valid and effective.

SECTION III: All parts of the 1962 Ordinance on the Creation of the Zoning Board of Appeals are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and after notice as provided by law.
