Town of Franklin Ordinance on the Participation in Regional Planning

SECTION I: Pursuant to the provisions of Public Act Section 613 of the 1959 session of the General Assembly, the Town of Franklin hereby adopts Public Act 613 of the General Statutes and joins in the creation of the Regional Planning Agency for the Southeastern Connecticut Planning Region, as defined by the Connecticut Development Commission under the provisions of Public Act 448 of the 1959 Session of the General Assembly.

SECTION II: The Town of Franklin, having a population of 972 according to the Federal Census of 1960, shall have two representatives on the agency to be selected in the following manner: beginning with the town election in October 1963, one representative shall be elected for a twoyear term and one representative for a four-year term; thereafter, all terms shall be four years. The present representatives to this agency are to continue in office until their successors have been duly elected and take office.

SECTION III: Any representative who is absent from three consecutive regular meetings of the Regional Planning Agency and any intervening duly-called special meeting thereof shall be considered to have resigned from said Regional Planning Agency, and the vacancy shall be filled by the Board of Selectmen until the term expires, except that the requirements of this section may be waived where illness or other extenuating circumstances make it impossible for a representative to meet the attendance requirement of this section.

SECTION IV: This ordinance shall become effective on October 18, 1960.
